



Class "C" Facilities

A **Class C** facility is:

- a public wading pool
 - a public spray pad or public splash pad
 - a water slide receiving basin that serves solely as a receiving basin for persons at the bottom of a water slide
-
- All Class C facilities must notify HPEPH in writing at least 14 days prior to opening to the public or re-opening after closure of more than 4 weeks.
 - The owner of the facility must designate an operator.
 - These facilities must be inaccessible to persons not involved in the operation, inspection or maintenance, except during the daily use period.
 - Water must be free from visible matter that may be hazardous to the health or safety of the bathers.
 - Where water is recirculating, the water must be filtered and disinfected.
 - Recommend additional signage clearly indicating the facility's health and safety rules.

Wading Pools

- Ensure attendant supervision at all times the public wading pool is in operation. If wading pool is operated in conjunction with a public pool, the supervision of the wading pool is in addition to any required bathing supervision for the public pool.
- Chemistry and testing requirements are the same as for a spa (excluding temperature).
- Safety equipment required:
 - First aid kit, device for emergency communications, and emergency equipment appropriate for use in the public wading pool

Spray Pads / Splash Pads

- Post clearly visible signage in a conspicuous place notifying parents or guardians to supervise their children at all times when using the public spray pad or public splash pad. (Recommend parents or guardians have a device for emergency communications present and operational).
