# Who Completed the Survey?

In the fall of 2013, the Hastings & Prince Edward Counties Healthy Communities Partnership conducted a situational assessment on healthy eating and active living. The following is a brief summary of findings for the City of Belleville.

#### **Planning & Investment in Active Transportation**

- ➤ 88% of residents agreed and 85% of stakeholders rated it as important for the city to invest in infrastructure improvements that provide more opportunities for active transportation.
- ➤ 83% of residents agreed and 76% of stakeholders rated it as important for the city to create a plan to guide the development of walking and cycling routes.
- > 92% of residents agreed and 96% of stakeholders rated it as important for the city to design roads that are safe and attractive to pedestrians, cyclists, and people who use public transportation.

#### Children & Youth

> 94% of residents agreed and 85% of stakeholders rated it as important for the city to make it easier for children and youth to walk or ride their bike to and from school.

#### **Land Use Planning & Connectivity**

- ➤ 88% of residents agreed and 81% of stakeholders rated it as important for the city to design roads, including rural roads and off road trails so people can cycle and walk safely between neighbourhoods, villages, and municipalities.
- ➤ 86% of residents agreed and 80% of stakeholders rated it as important for the city to connect trails for people to walk or cycle between neighbourhoods, villages and municipalities.

75 % of residents agreed that they would more likely vote for a municipal candidate if they support improving opportunities for walking, cycling and/or public transit.
