What topics will be covered?

- Food safety laws/regulations.
- Risk factors linked to food-borne illness.
- Preventing food-borne illness.
- Introduction to food safety quality assurance processes (HACCP).
- Raising awareness about food allergies.

What will I receive?

- A course manual at registration.
- A probe thermometer.
- A wallet card certificate (upon successful completion of the course)*.
