- You will have the knowledge needed to protect the public's health.
- You will have a skill sought after by employers in the food industry

Who should become a certified food handler?

Anyone who works in food preparation e.g., restaurant worker, daycare employee, hospital/nursing home staff



What topics will be covered?

- Food safety legislation
- Foodborne illness and food allergies
- Microorganisms
- The Food Safety Sequence - receiving to reheating and everything in between

What will I receive?

- A course manual
- A probe thermometer
- A wallet card certificate valid for 5 years when you complete the course and pass the exam

When is this course available?
