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Publicly Funded Influenza Vaccines for Ontario this Season; Reporting Requirements; Ordering / Pick-Up & Delivery

This memorandum is to provide you with the most up to date information regarding the 2022-23 Universal Influenza Immunization Program (UIIP).

It is recommended that all individuals ages 6 months or older who live, work or attend school in Ontario receive the influenza vaccine. *High-risk groups should be immunized first.

Individuals at high risk of influenza-related complications or who are more likely to require

hospitalization:

- All pregnant women
- People who are residents of nursing homes or other chronic care facilities
- People \geq 65 years of age
- All children 6 to 59 months of age
- Indigenous peoples
- Adults or children 6 months of age and over with chronic health conditions as follows:
 - Cardiac or pulmonary disorders,
 - Diabetes mellitus or other metabolic disease,
 - o Cancer,
 - Conditions or medication which compromise the immune system (due to underlying disease, therapy or both,
 - Renal disease.
 - Anemia or hemoglobinopathy,
 - o Neurologic or neurodevelopment conditions, or
 - Morbid obesity (body mass index of \geq 40).

 Children and adolescents (6 months to 18 years) undergoing treatment with acetylsalicylic acid for long periods

*According to the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI), egg-allergic individuals may be vaccinated against influenza using the full dose of any appropriate product, including QIV, and high-dose QIV

* MDV = Multi Dose Vial

* PFS = Pre-Filled Syringe

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Important Notes:

- Fluzone® Quadrivalent and Fluzone® High-Dose Quadrivalent are different products. Fluzone® High-Dose is only authorized for those 65 years of age and over. Please use caution when administering Fluzone® products to ensure that the right vaccine is being administered to the right person.
- Fluzone® High-Dose QIV and Fluad: Distribution will be prioritized to Long Term Care & Retirement Homes and QHC. Remaining supply will be equitably distributed to health care providers.

VACCINE UTILIZATION REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

For the 2022/23 UIIP season, the Ministry of Health no longer requires vaccine utilization reports from facilities that participate in the UIIP.

Reimbursement submission requirements for eligible organizations holding public influenza vaccine clinics still apply. Please see the <u>Reimbursement for administration</u> section of the Ministry's website for more information.

Pharmacies that administer influenza vaccine to individuals without an OHIP card must complete a <u>Universal Influenza Immunization Program Pharmacy Form</u> for these doses, for vaccine administration tracking purposes.

ORDERING INFORMATION

PARTICIPATING PHARMACIES with Trained Pharmacists:

- You will order and receive flu vaccine through your distributor.
- You must submit four weeks of fridge temperature logs to HPEPH. These must be submitted on the 1st and the 15th of each month, starting October 1st (fax to 613-966-1813 or email to VPDCalendar@hpeph.ca).
- If you are aware of a planned power outage or if your fridge goes below 2 degrees Celsius or above 8 degrees Celsius, please contact HPEPH at 613-966-5500 ext.222.
- Failure to submit temperature logs will result in the suspension of vaccine ordering until the temperature log is received.

- Use this year's Influenza Vaccine Order Form included with this letter. **Do NOT use HPEPH's routine Vaccine/STI Medication Order Form.** A link to the appropriate form is also provided at <u>www.ontario.ca/influenza</u> or go to <u>www.forms.ssb.gov.on.ca</u> and search for flu vaccine order form.
- <u>All</u> orders must be faxed to 613-966-1813, along with four weeks of fridge temperature logs.
- Ensure you have 1-inch 3ml needle/syringe combos on hand, as well as 1-inch needle tips, as vaccine provided will be multi-dose vials and prefilled syringe.

PICK-UP / DELIVERY

- Belleville Clients orders after October 31 will be available at our Belleville office (must have 3 business days between order and pickup) ***see above schedule for prior pick up times**
- **Trenton Clients** –orders will be available for pick up (Oct 5, 18 or 19, Nov 8 or 9. Further pick ups for Influenza vaccine will be every Tuesday or Wednesday, beginning the week of Nov 14)
- **Centre Hastings Clients** –orders will be delivered to your office (October 6, October 18, November 9 and November 18)
- **Bancroft Clients** –orders will be available for pick up at the HPEPH office (October 11, October 20, November 10 and November 22)

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• **Prince Edward County** –orders will be available for pick up at the HPEPH office (October 6, October 20, November 4th and November 18th)
