- Increase in funding from the Province for the Ontario Seniors Dental Care Program (ODSCP).
- Both Councillor Sandison and Chair Albert thanked staff for delivering a financially prudent budget.

- Dr. Toumishey noted that respiratory season is upon us and we are expecting it to be a
 more difficult season than we have seen in recent years so he is encouraging all to stay
 up to date with both the COVID-19 and flu shots, stay home when ill, wear a mask when
 recovering and wash your hands.
- The Healthy Families team is launching a nurse delivered cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) group for women experiencing postpartum depression and anxiety. Staff training is expected to take place in January 2023 with recruitment of clients starting in the spring of 2023.
- Dr. Toumishey ended with a thank you to all members of the Board and that it has been a privilege working with them. Dr. Toumishey took the opportunity to thank Chair Albert for her leadership as Chair for the last five (5) years and prior to that her work on the Board, having put in a total of ten (10) years.

12.1 Harm Reduction and Decriminalization

- Stephanie McFaul, Program Manager and Jeremy Owens, Public Health Nurse presented on the subject of harm reduction and decriminalization of illicit drugs noting a few salient points.
- Last year, over 40 people died in suspected drug-related deaths in HPE. The majority of those deaths have involved fentanyl with the majority of those lives lost being between 25 and 44 years of age.
- There was much discussion around these topics and the letter presented but ultimately these are bigger, more multi-pronged issues than what Public Health can deal with and there is need for more input from community agencies.

THAT the Board of Health recommend advocating for more funding to go towards harm reduction and decriminalization activities and tasking with more community partners.

THE BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE HASTINGS AND PRINCE EDWARD COUNTIES HEALTH UNIT

BY-LAW NO. 2023-01 Annual By-Law to authorize the borrowing of up to \$1,000,000

WHEREAS the Board of Health for the Hastings and Prince Edward Counties Health Unit (hereinafter called the "Board") deems it necessary to borrow the sum of up to \$1,000,000 to meet expenditures of the Board for the year until the municipal levies and government grants are received:

THEREFORE, the Board hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. The Chair of the Board and the Chair of the Finance Committee are hereby authorized on behalf of the Board to borrow from time to time by way of promissory note from the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, a sum or sums not exceeding \$1,000,000 to meet the current expenditures of the Board for the year until the municipal levies and government grants are received, and to give on behalf of the Board, to the bank, a promissory note or notes and signed by the Chair of the Board and the Chair of the Finance Committee for the monies so borrowed, with interest at such rate as may be agreed upon from time to time with the Bank.
- 2. The interest costs for all sums borrowed pursuant to the authority of the by-law shall be charged as an expenditure against the revenues of the Board for the current year.
- 3. The Chair of the Finance Committee is hereby authorized and directed to apply in payment of all sums borrowed as aforesaid, together with the interest thereon, all of the monies hereafter collected are received either on account or realized in respect of levies and grants for the current year and preceding year or from any other source which may lawfully be applied for such purpose.

This by-law shall come into force and take effect immediately upon the approval thereof.
